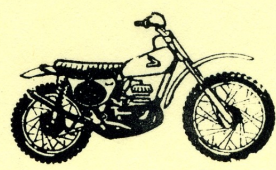




EDDIE SPEAKS

- Q. You are to date the single longest playing Eddie our cast has ever known. What is your favorite part of the show?
A. Eddie or the Time Warp. However, later on there are some good scenes also. It isn't easy to pick out my favorite - it's easier to pick out what I don't like.
Q. Since you've touched on the subject, what would you say is the largest detraction to the show?
A. Well, the bedroom scenes are slow moving, but they are critical to the plot...the part I don't like is when Eddie dies.
Q. What is your favorite cinema, out of all the ones we've played at?
A. We've always been treated very well at guest appearances. We didn't get very good treatment at the Cinerama. We received good treatment at the Fairlawn and where we are now we receive very fine treatment.
Q. What would you say is the best thing about Rocky as far as recommending it to someone who has never been there before?
A. The best thing about Rocky is it engulphs so much of life. Any one who goes to Rocky can find something to relate to. There's something there for everyone.
Q. Have you ever seen audience members come dressed as characters in the movie?
A. Yes. I used to but not as much anymore. I enjoy seeing it because it shows people are into the show.
Q. Is there an incident that stands out the most in your mind?
A. There are so many after five years. There is the time we went on strike at the Cinerama because of mistreatment by the management. The anniversary shows - they were quite memorable. There used to be something called Freaked Out Friday where cast members would change parts around and generally mess up the show.

- Q. What would you like to see our show do as far as improving itself goes?
A. Our cast has made some big steps forward recently. In time, we'll be better but the audiences have been improving themselves also. Our low point is usually when we first move into a cinema, but we improve as time goes by. We get used to our surroundings and gradually improve.

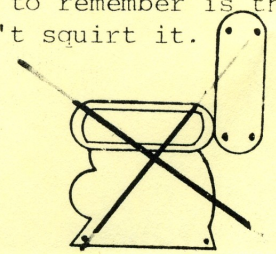
STAY OUTTA DE TOILETS!
