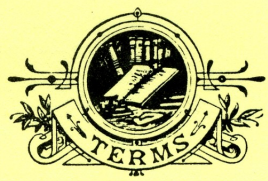
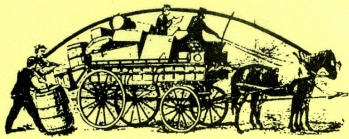




Trip to SMU

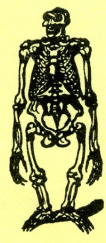
