Whatever Happened to ... Fay Wray

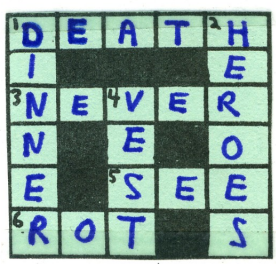

WHEN Fay Wray steps out, can King Kong be far behind? Well, it's 53 years later and the great ape was nowhere in sight when his favorite gal, now 79, dined at Spago's in Los Angeles. After the huge gorilla went ape over her in the classic 1933 film, Wray became a cult figure, appearing in a series of low-budget horror films. She retired from the screen in 1958 and now lives in Century City with her third husband, neurosurgeon Sanford Rothenberg.
