Rocky Horror began in England many years ago when Richard O'Brian wrote his musical, "The Rocky Horror Show". The musical was a spoof of classic horror movies like "King Kong" and "Dr. Frankenstein".

Although a hit in England, by the time Rocky hit the states, trans- vestitism was already passe and the musical bombed on Broadway.

Not to be put down easily, O'Brian wrote the screen play to "The Rocky Horror Picture Show". 20th Century Fox filmed the movie musical, starr- ing Tim Curry, Susan Saranden, Barry Bostwick and O'Brian as Riff Raff.

The movie was released in 1975 and subsequently bombed. It wasn't until Rocky Horror was moved to the mid- night circuit when it found its aud- ience.

It wasn't long before audiences began yelling lines out during the movie and throwing toast and rice. The formation of casts soon followed.

Rocky Horror is today the world's ultimate cult movie, wich is cele- brating its 11th aniversary this month. Richard O'Brian wrote ano- ther movie, a sequal to Rocky Horror called, "Shock Treatment". It was released several years ago, but has not enjoyed the success of its pre- decessor.
