SUSAN SARANDON

usan Abigail Tomalin was born in New York City on October 4, 1946, and grew up in Metuchen, New Jersey. While attending Catholic University in Washington, D.C., she married actor Chris Sarandon. (The two have since divorced.) Accompanying her husband on an audition, Sarandon was offered a small role—as the hippie daughter of the mad-as-hell advertising executive in Joe-and thus began her acting career. Following a stint on the soap A World Apart, she worked steadily but without serious ambition in feature films, playing innocent Janet Weiss in the cult favorite The Rocky Horror Picture Show, Brooke Shields's mother in both Pretty Baby and King of the Gypsies (Sarandon thinks she doesn't look a thing like Shields), and Sally, the apple of Burt Lancaster's eye, in Atlantic City, for which she received an Oscar nomination. Demonstrating a new commitment to acting, she performed off-Broadway in A Coupla White Chicks Sitting Around Talking and then in Extremities. She recently starred onscreen as the investigative housewife in Frank Perry's Compromising Positions and, last year, as an uptight cellist unwound by sorcerer Jack Nicholson in The Witches of Eastwick.
